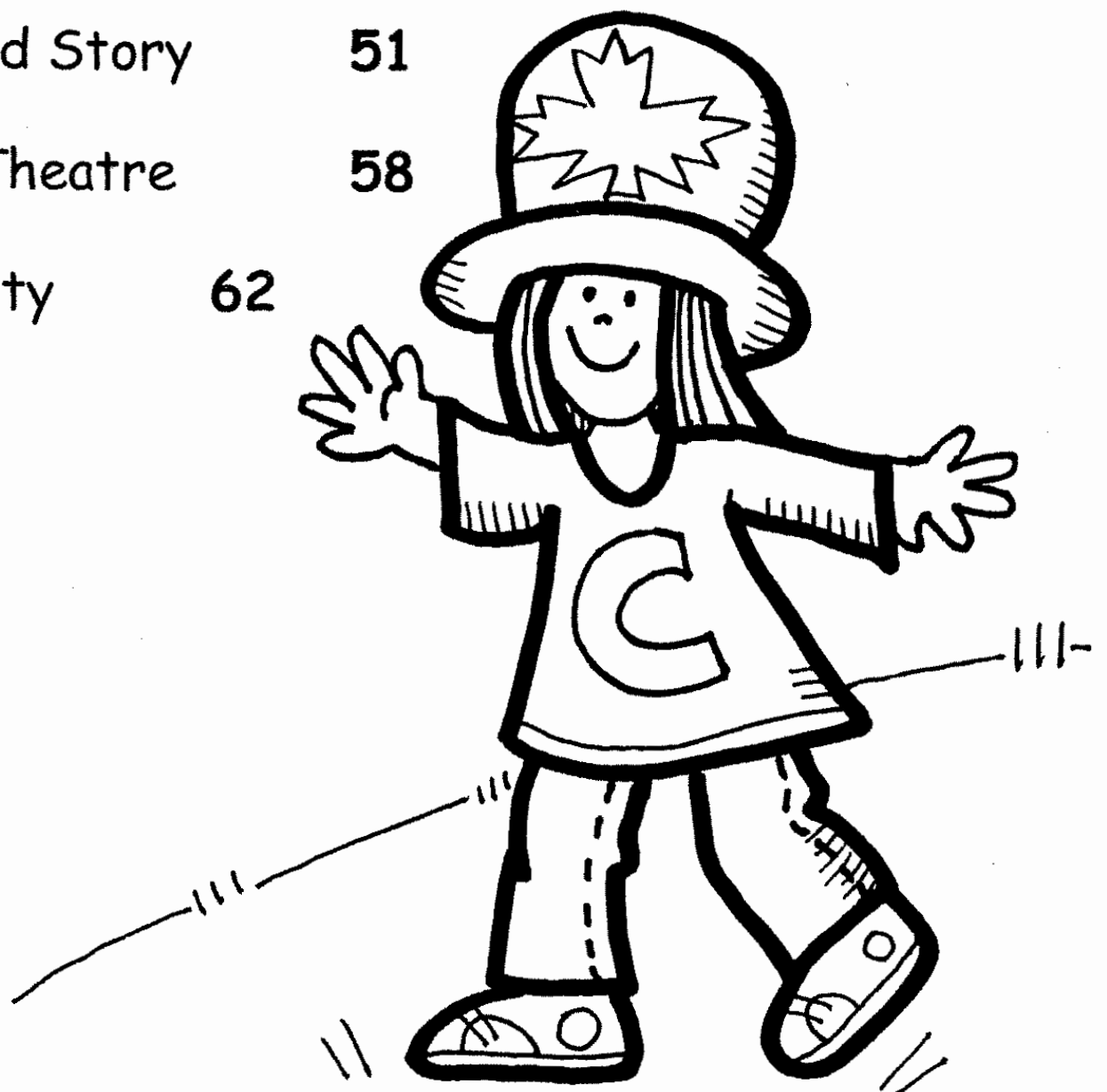
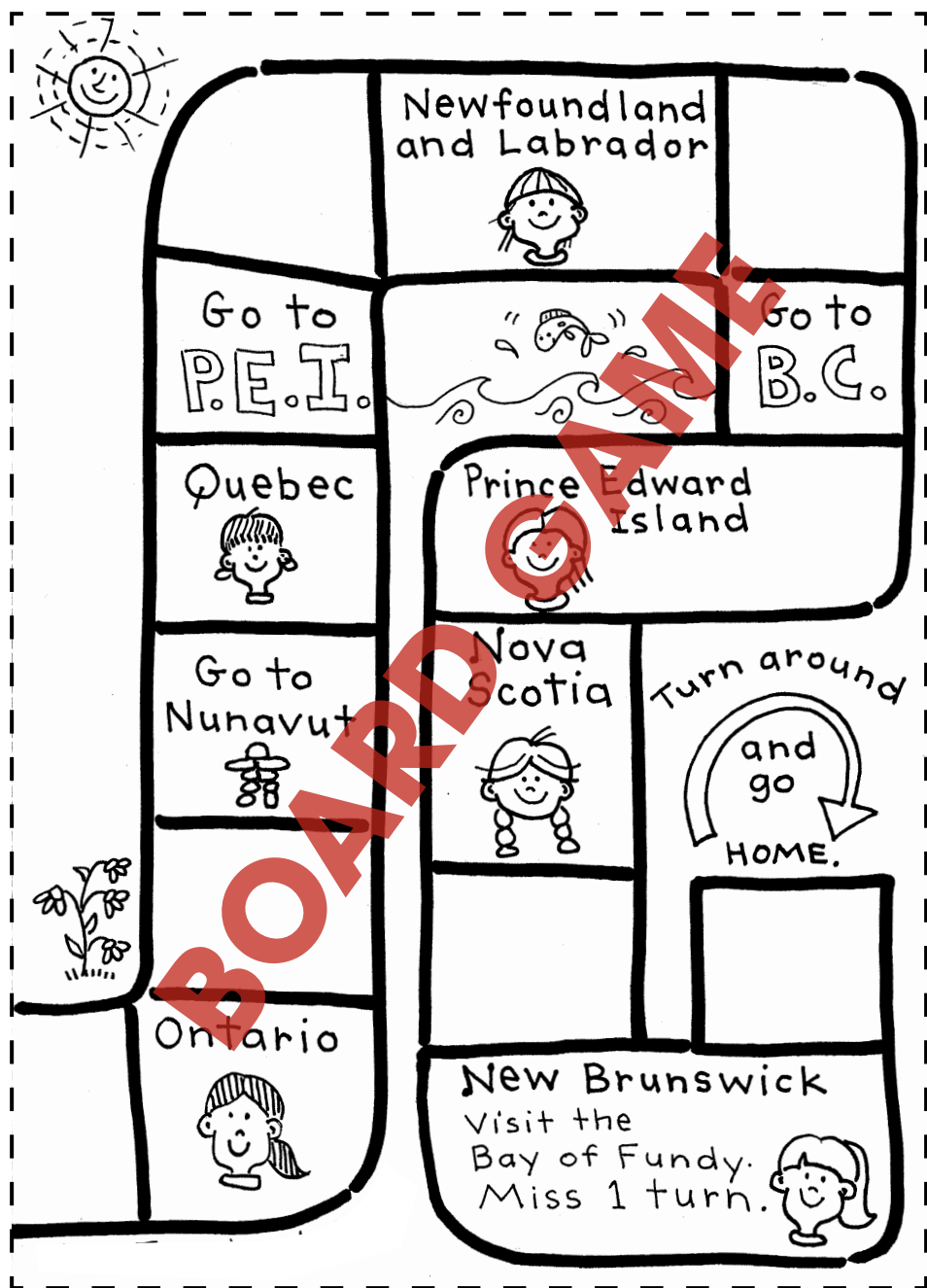

- ✓ scissors, glue, pencil crayons

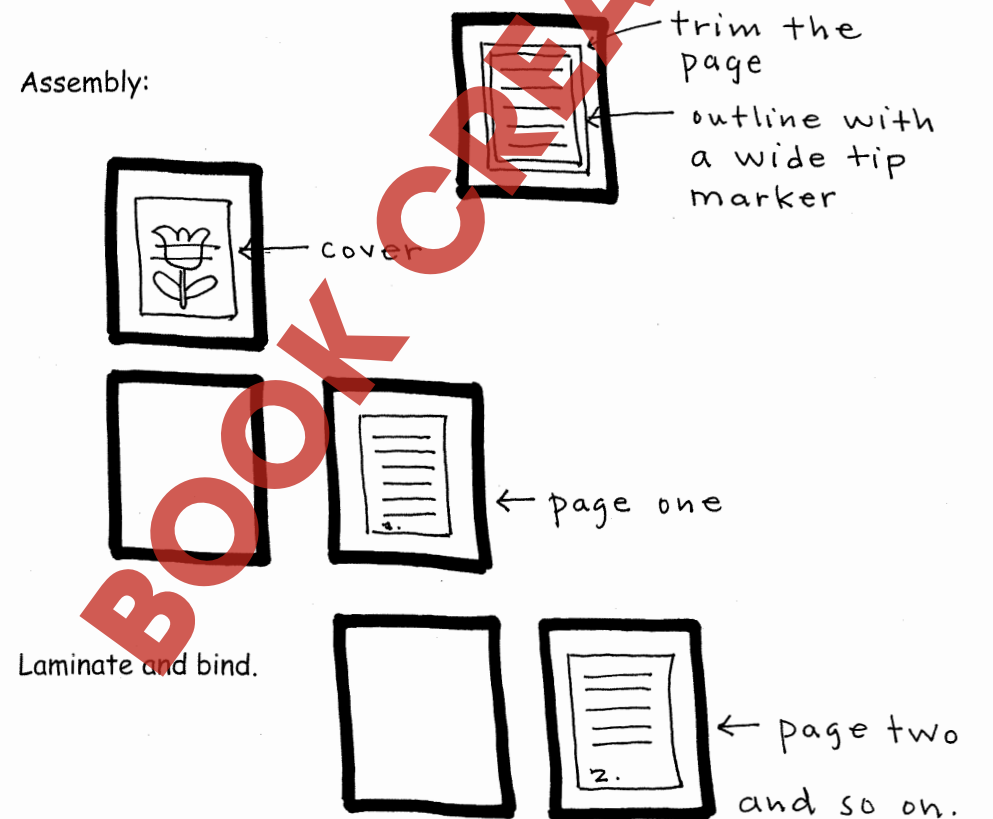
How to set up a big book

Make copies of the originals. Enlarge to 11X17" for an even bigger book. Use larger cardstock for the book pages.

Colour the pictures.

Trim the pages. Outline with a wide tip marker. Glue the pages onto the cardstock starting with the cover. Glue page one onto the first page and so on. See the assembly diagram.

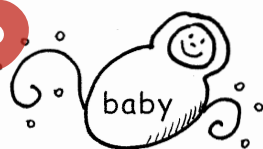

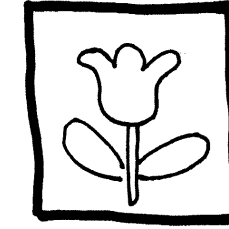

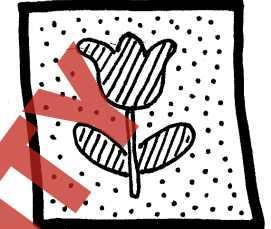


1. Draw

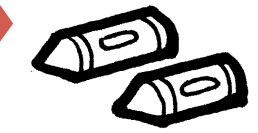
Keep it simple!

3. Crinkle

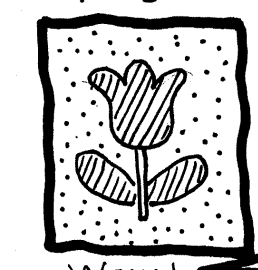


4. Paint

"I will start grazing my way there tomorrow. I want to win the gold in wrestling."

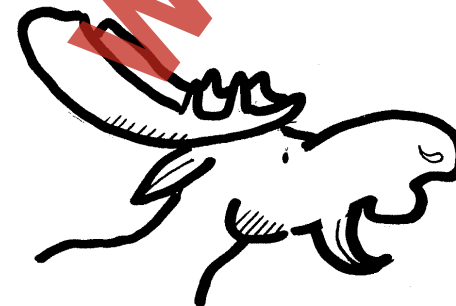
