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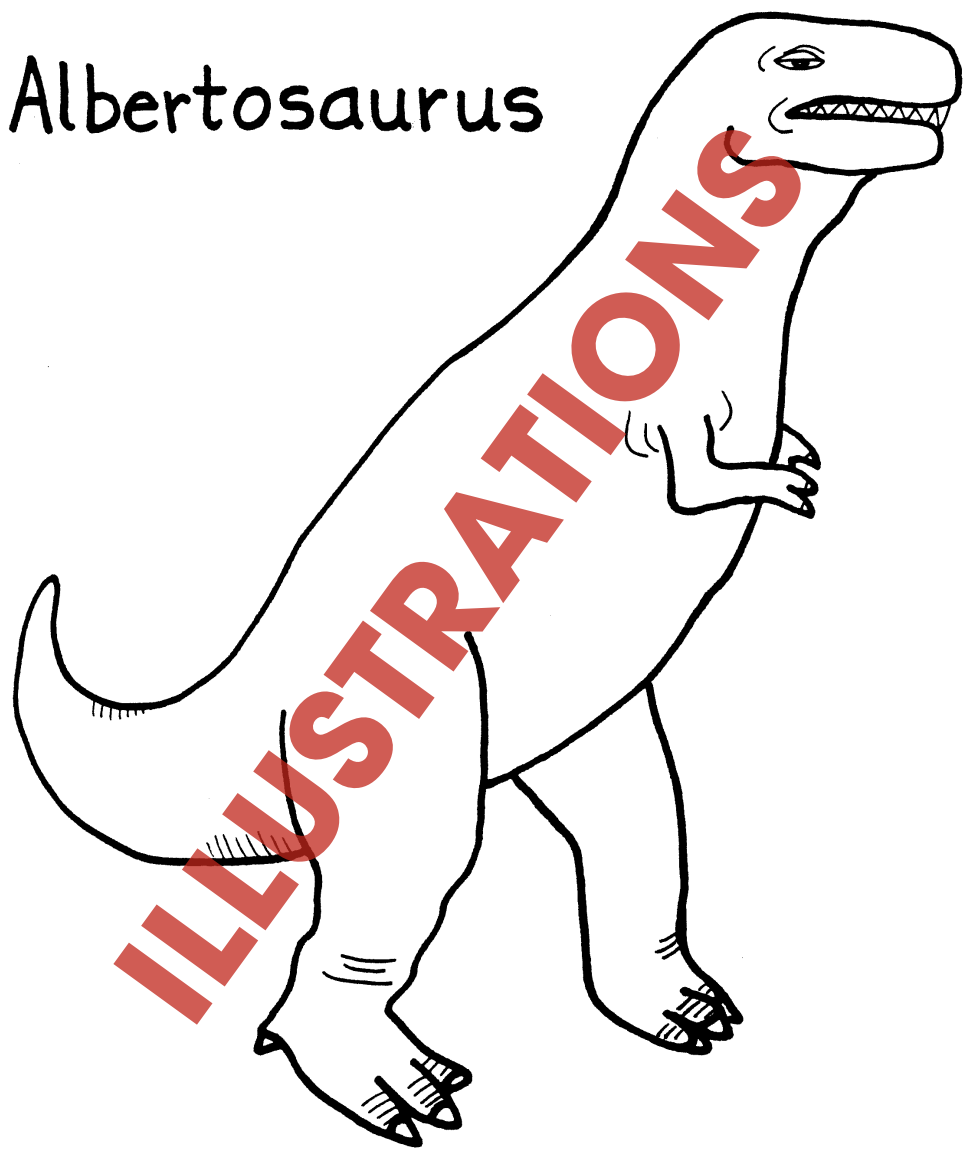
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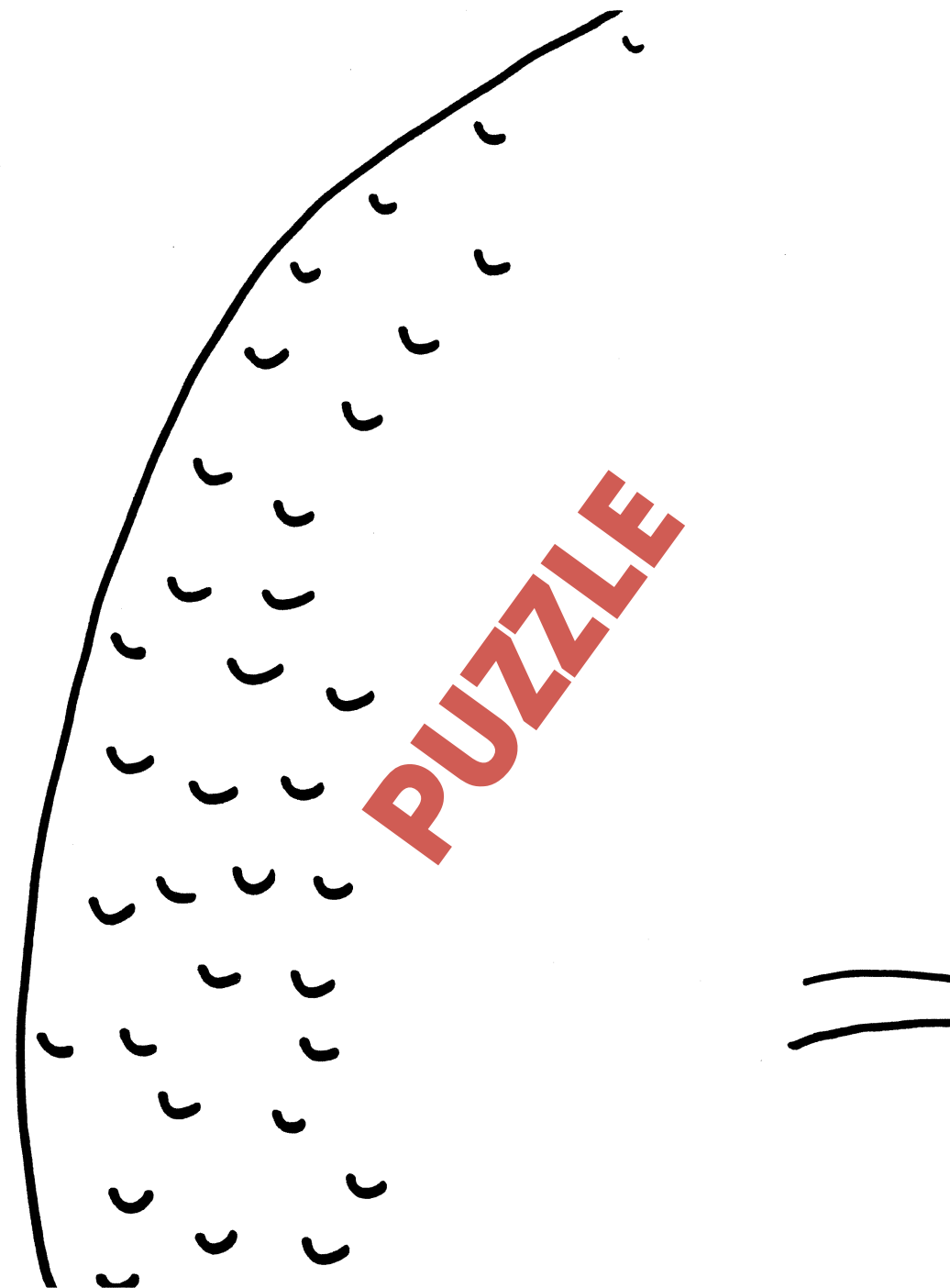

Dinosaur Footprint Fun

Here's a fun way to start your day if you would like to feature a certain dinosaur.

Cut out the footprint pattern. Trace onto black construction paper and cut out. Make as many sets of footprints as you need.

Mount the footprints on the classroom wall or in the hallway and make them lead up to a dinosaur illustration. Cover up the name of the dinosaur.

The children can have fun guessing what kind of dinosaur it is.

Each day the children can find a new dinosaur at the end of the footprints.



ART ACTIVITY

I Am a Dinosaur

This is a dinosaur story for fun and colour recognition.

To make the Big Book, you will need 3 sheets of two ply bristol of a bright colour, a large envelope, self-adhesive velcro.

1. Photocopy and colour the story pages and a dinosaur for each page. Make sure that that you colour the dinosaurs the colours indicated in the story.

2. Divide each bristol sheet into 4 equal pieces to give you nine pages for the book. Use the remaining bristol to mount the dinosaurs.

3. Assemble as shown:
Glue on the cover.

Glue on the title page on the inside cover.

Glue in the first page.

And so on.

Glue the envelope on the back cover to store the dinosaurs.

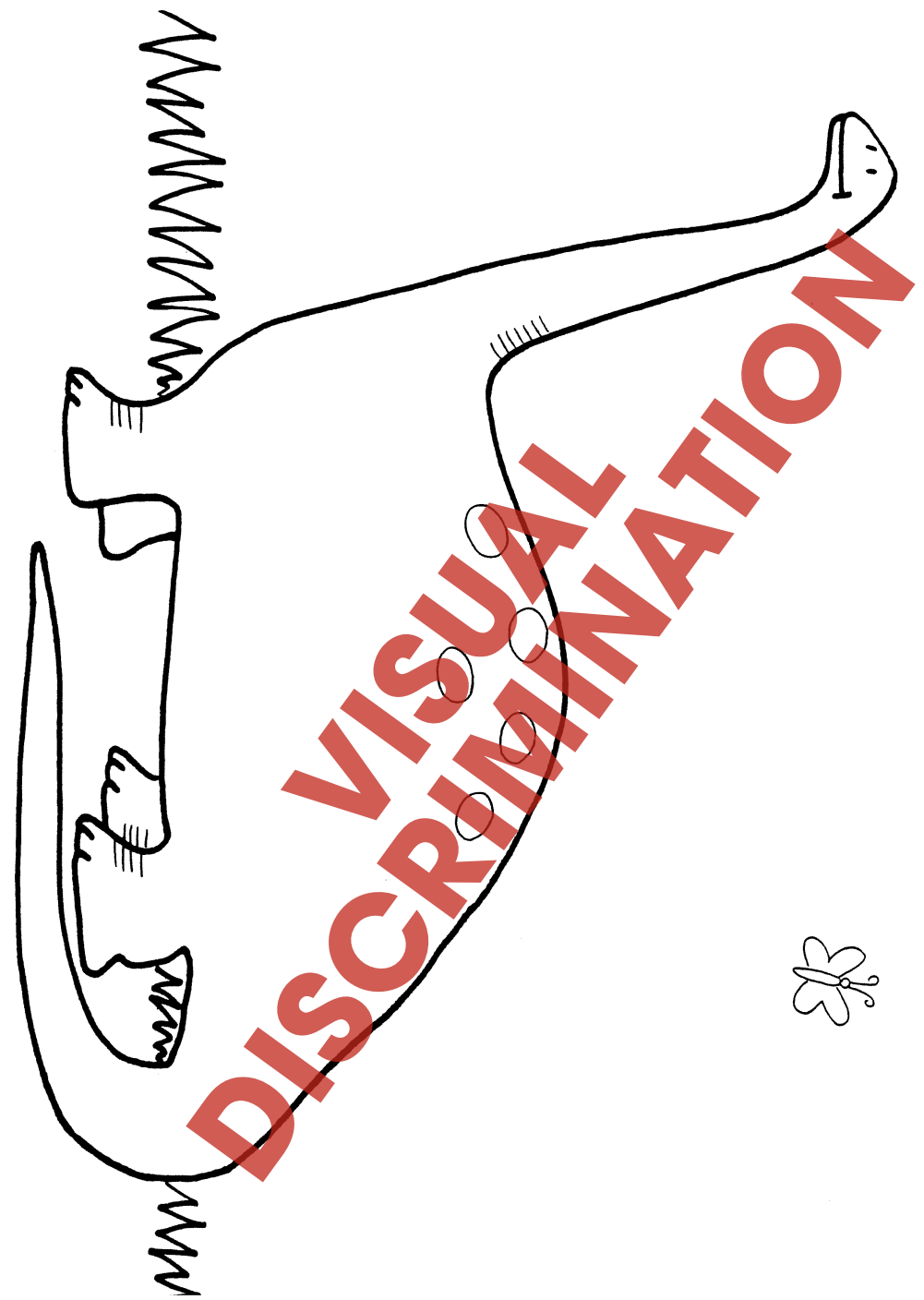
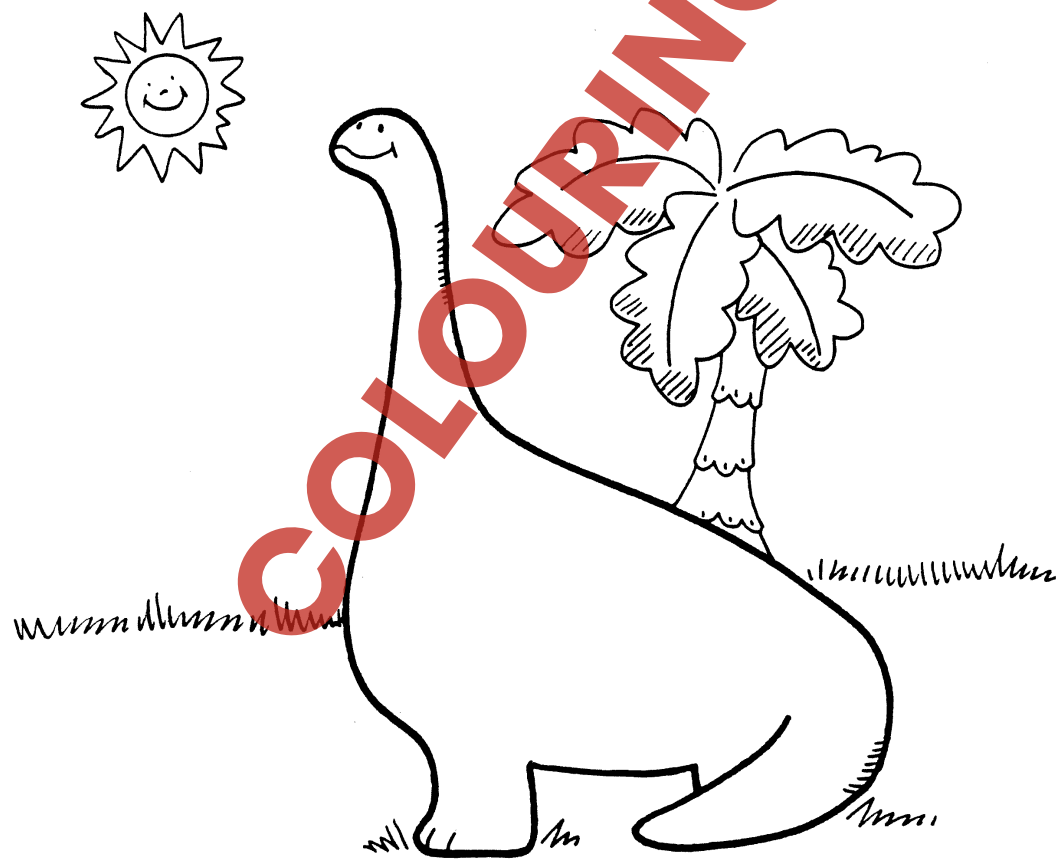


Laminate the pages and the dinosaurs and bind. Fasten self adhesive velcro on the pages where the small X is located, and onto the backs of the dinosaurs, at the base of the dino's neck.

TELLING THE STORY: ask your audience to help you find the dinosaurs. Have the dinosaurs displayed on your flannelboard.
