

## How to Make a Big Book-Stego

You will need:


4 green 4-ply bristol sheets that measure approx. 51 x 76 cm (23 x 28"), glue, scissors, crayons or markers, metre stick.


What to do:

1. Cut the bristol pages 11" wide.

Cut the lengths as follows: Cut 1 of each @ 3.5", 7", 10.5" 14". Cut 3 of each @ 17.5"

- 2. Colour and cut out the illustrations and Stego letters for the cover. Cut out the text.
- 3. It's a good idea to fasten the text and pictures with a removable adhesive before you actually glue them on.







#### Letter to the Class


