Use a bright colour, avoiding neon colours as the brightness will distract from the text and illustrations.


Cut each sheet into 4 to make 9 pages, measuring 11 14.

Colour the cover and the rebus illustrations O photocopy onto yellow bond paper.

Assemble as shown.




LITTLE BOOKS

FLANNELBOARD

Colour, cut out and laminate the patterns. Prepare for flannel or magnetic board. Line up the animals beside the old lady as you or the children tell the story.


STORYTELLING

Colour and cut out the old lady in 2 parts. Cut out the circle area. Piece together and glue into 4-ply bristol. Cut out the circle again. Tape a 9" x 12" zipclose baggie onto the bag, behind the circle, with the opening at the top. Trim the bottom of the baggie and tape down on three sides.

Colour and cut out the animals. Mount onto bristol and laminate or photocopy directly onto manilla tag.

As you tell the story, drop the animals into the baggie.
