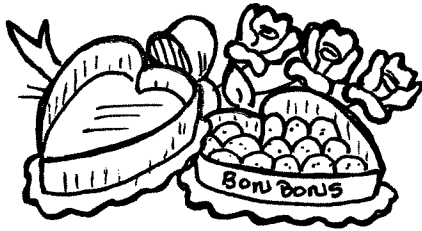

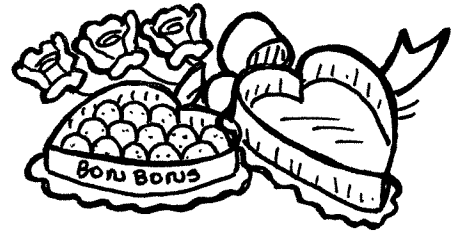

Student Objective: To match up the hearts of different sizes to the hearts of the creature.

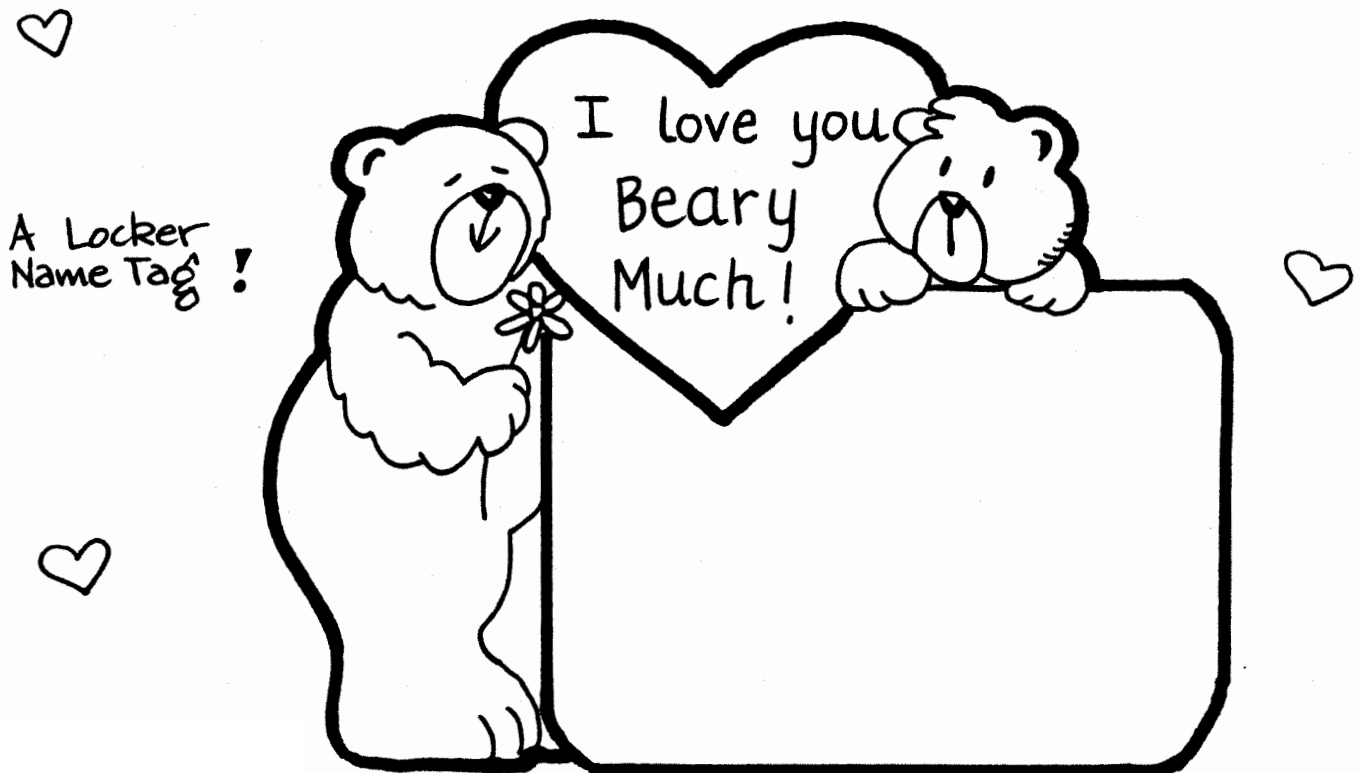
You'll need: crayons for coloring, red bristol (2-ply) and a file folder, glue, scissors.

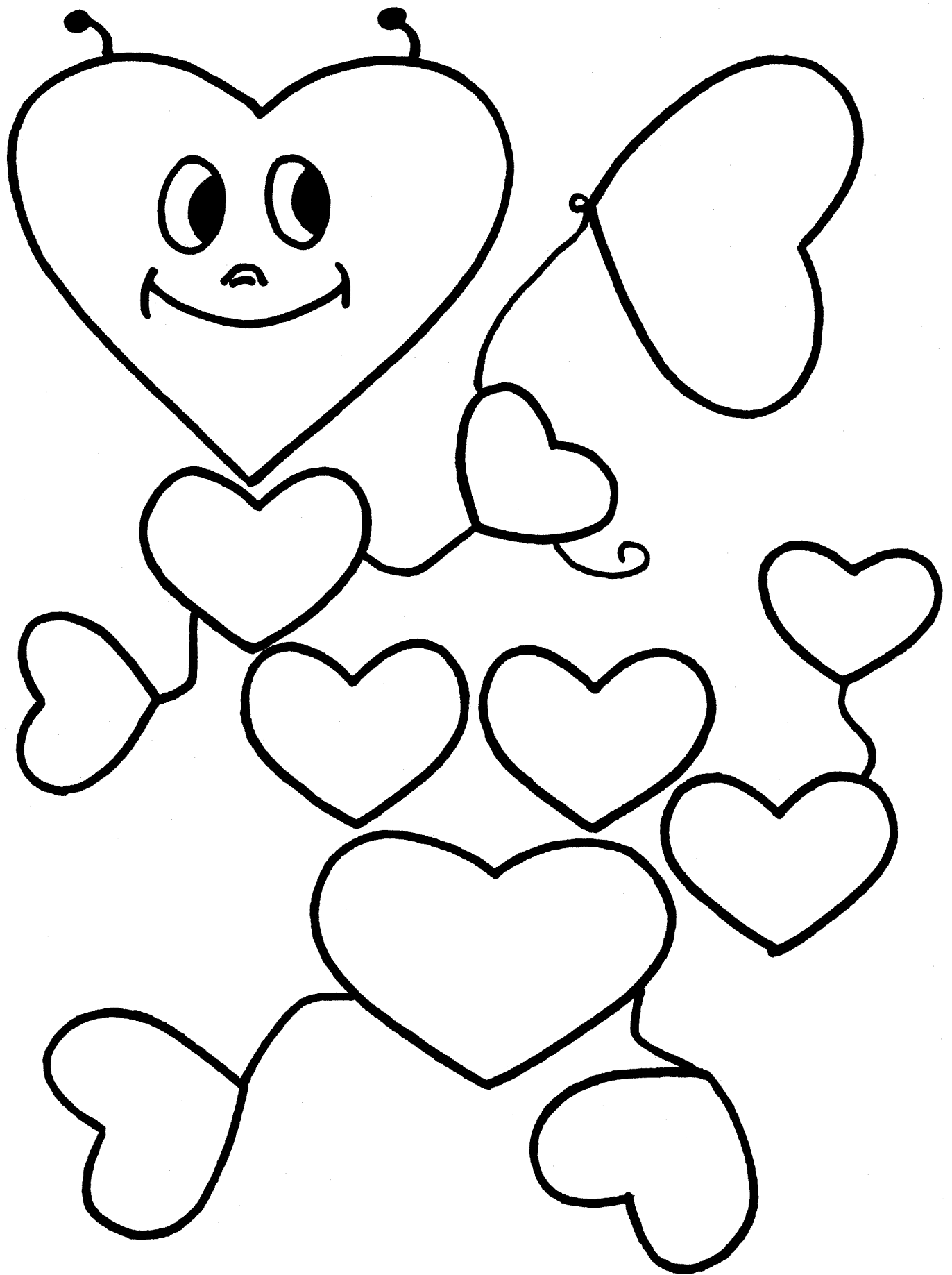
Color the creature made of hearts any color you wish. Glue into the inside of the folder.

♡ Lady Valentine ♡

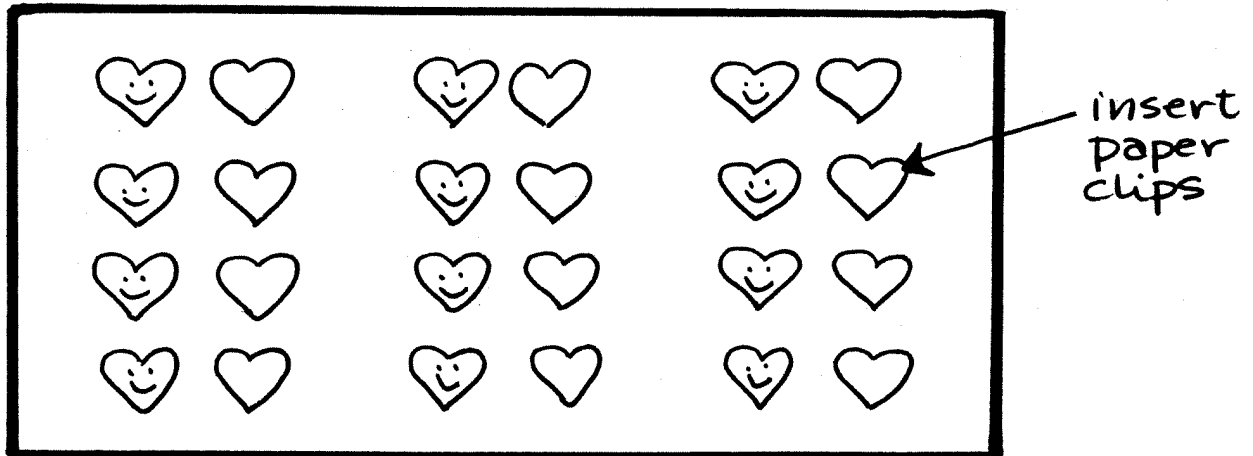
Student Objective: To match the ladies that are the same.

You'll need: 2 sheets red bristol (2 ply) crayons, glue, scissors.

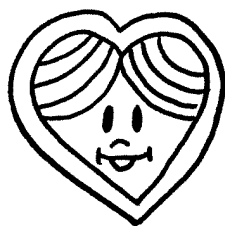
Photocopy another set of Valentine ladies.

Color the hair and the lips of the faces. Color each set the same as they will be matched.

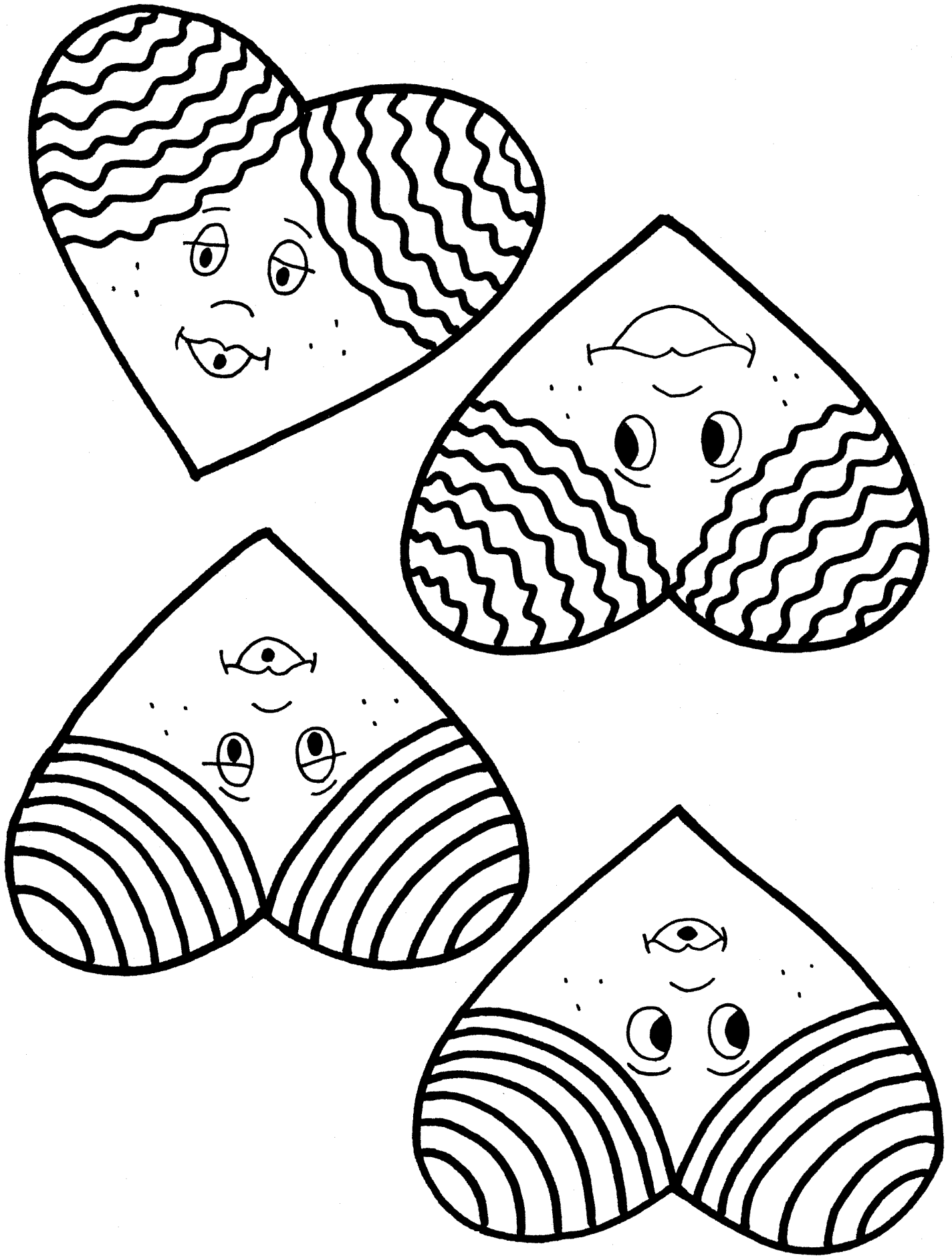
Cut out one set and glue onto large bristol sheet. Draw a heart beside each to place its match.

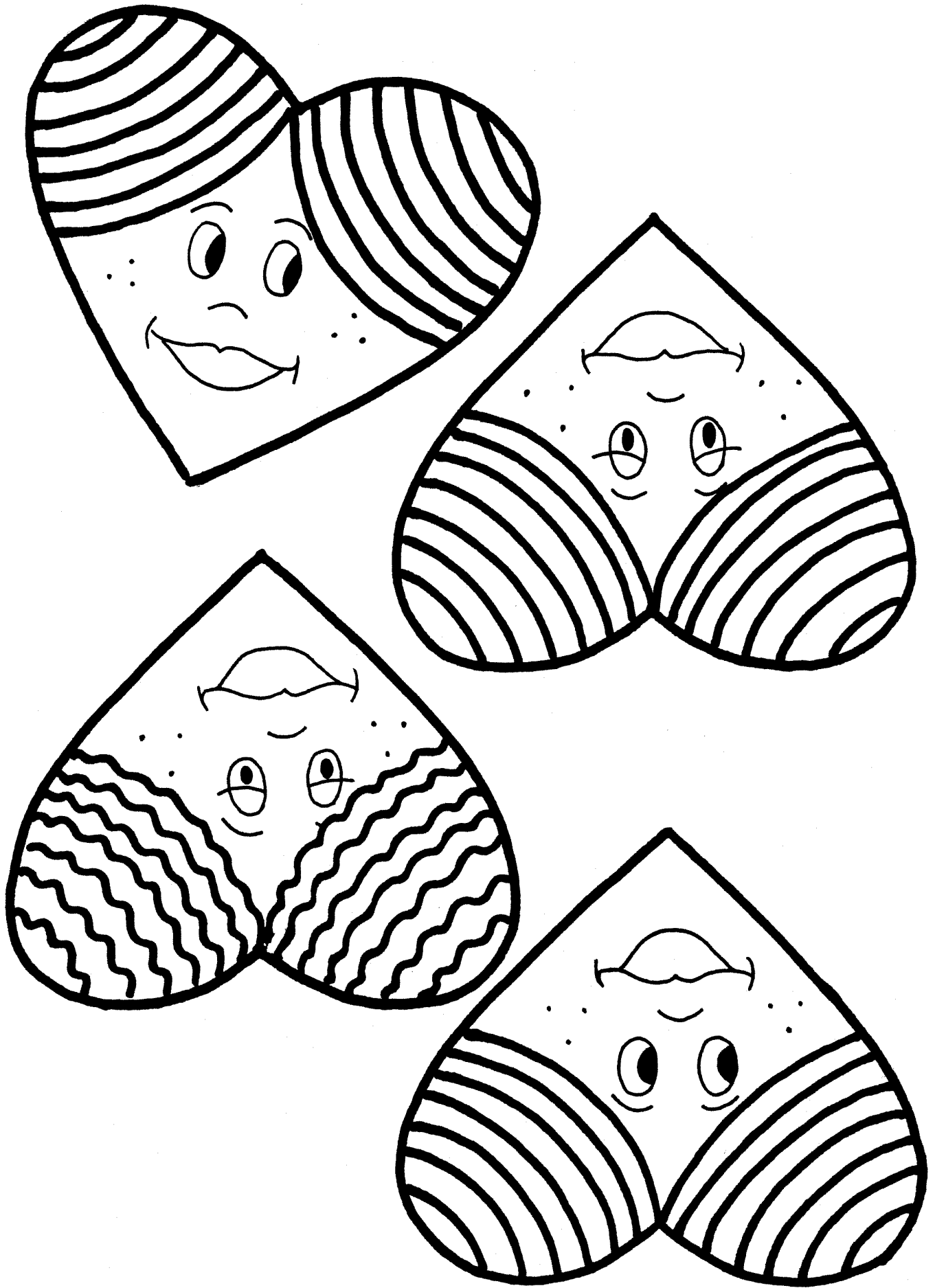


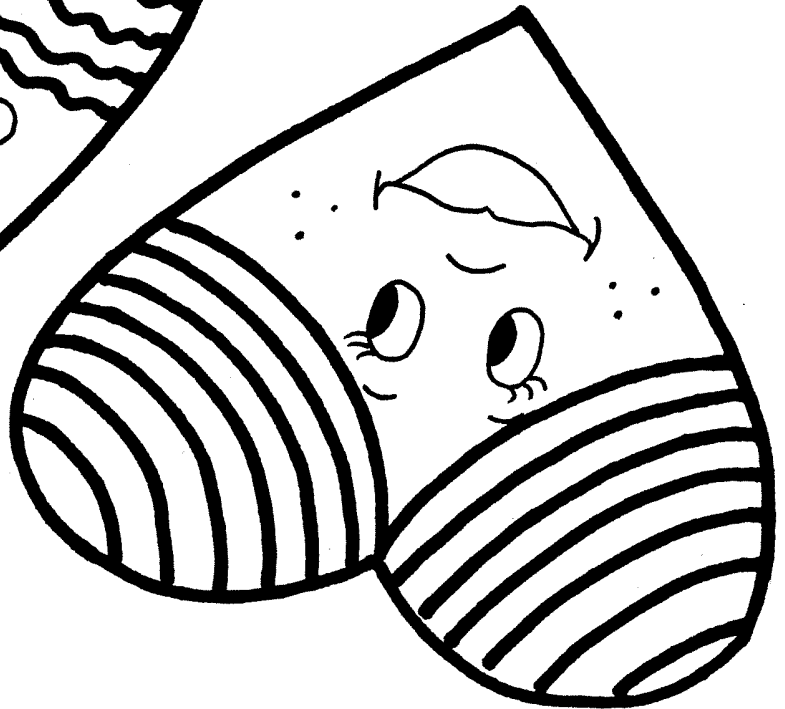
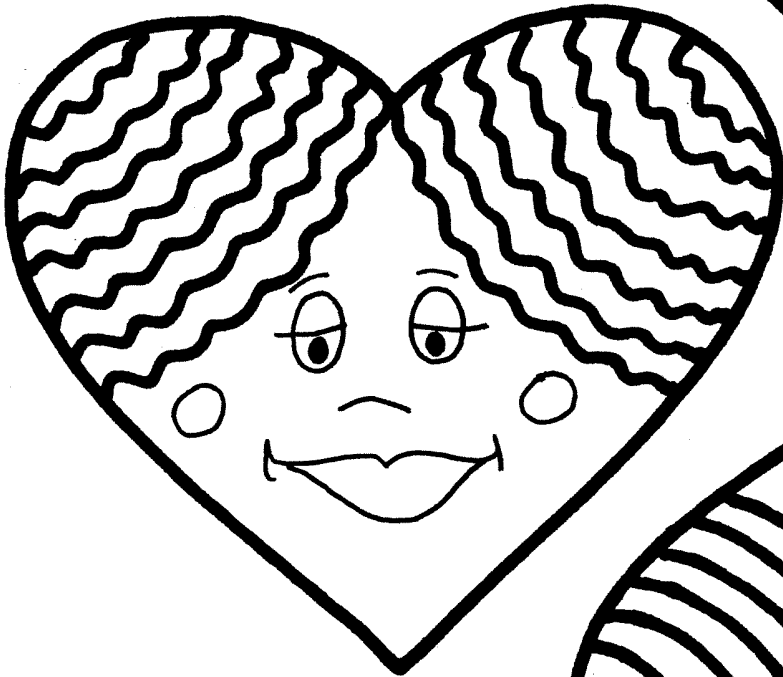
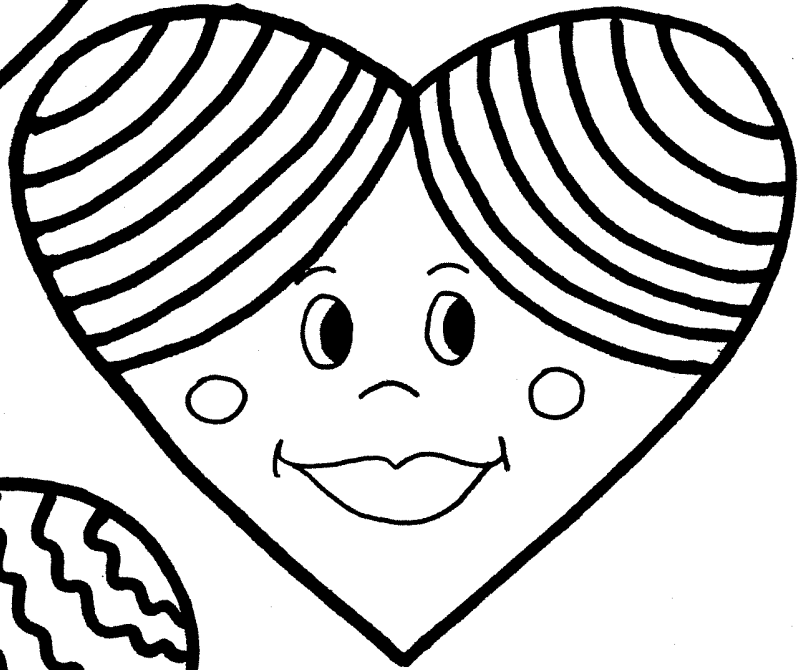
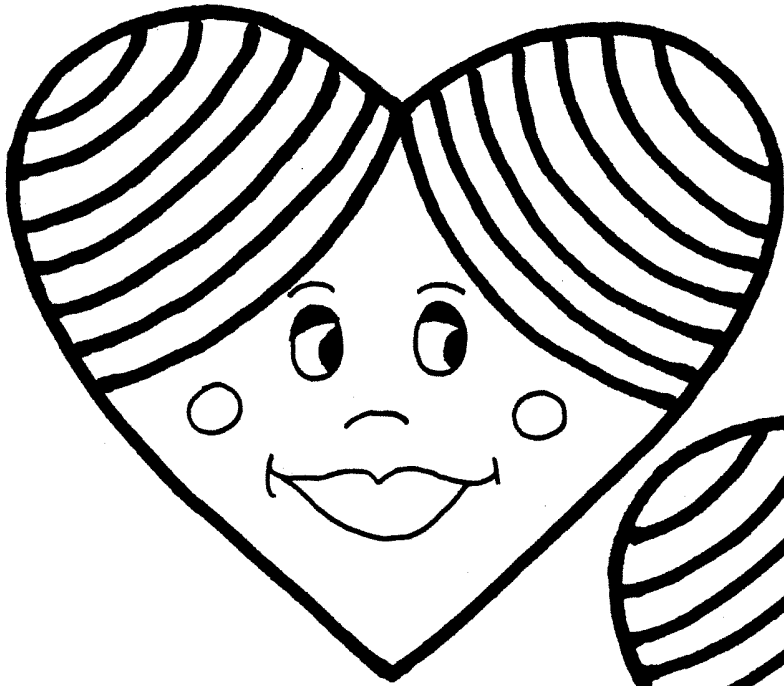
Cut out and glue the other set onto red bristol and cut out again leaving a 1/4" border of bristol.



Fasten to format with a paper clip.







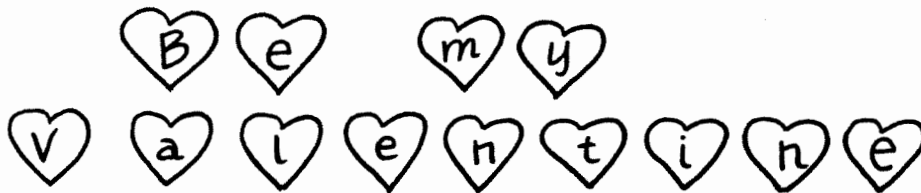
♡ Be My Valentine ♡

Cut out the heart pattern and trace 13 onto the red bristol. Cut out. Print the letters "Be my Valentine" on them.



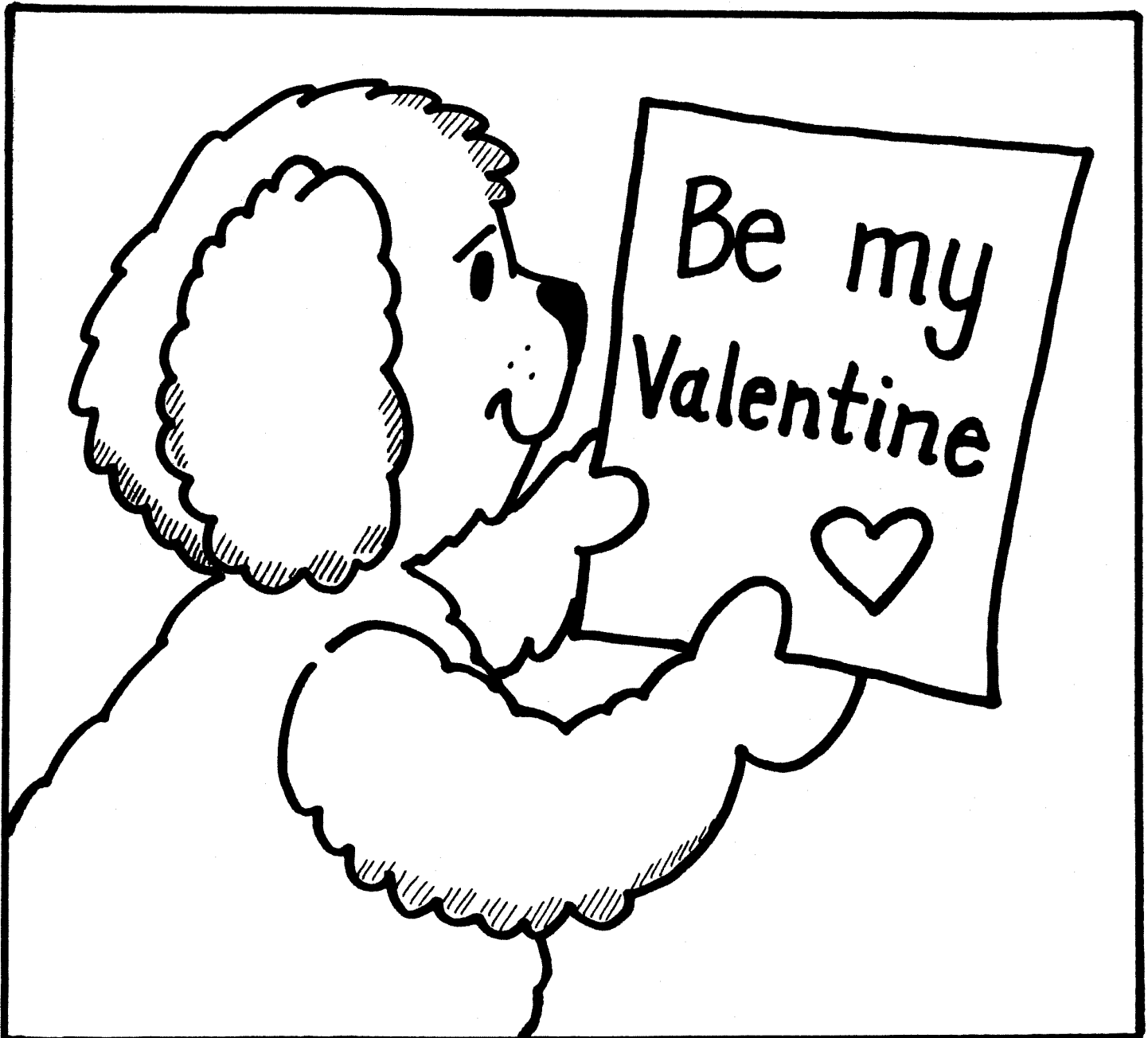
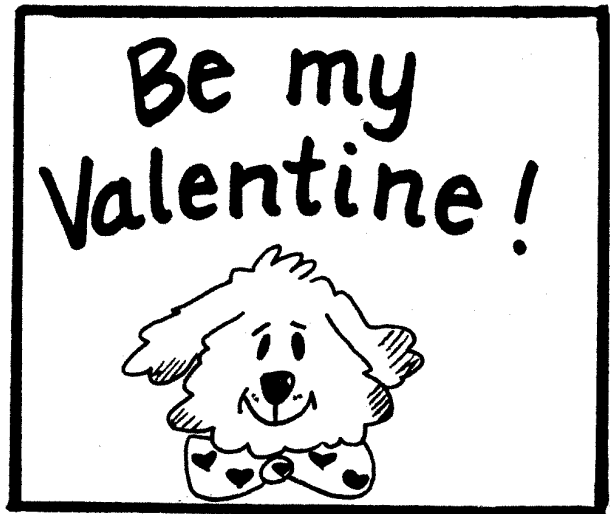
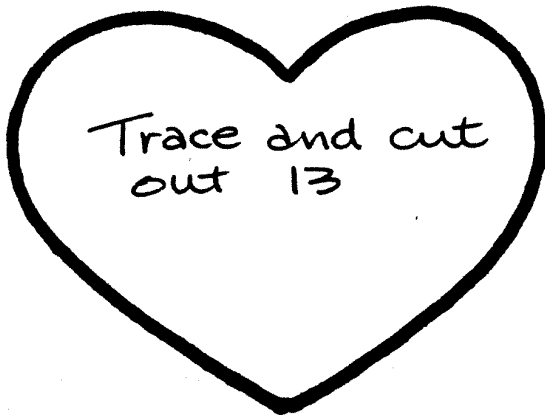
Store the hearts in a zipper bag which can be fastened to the file.

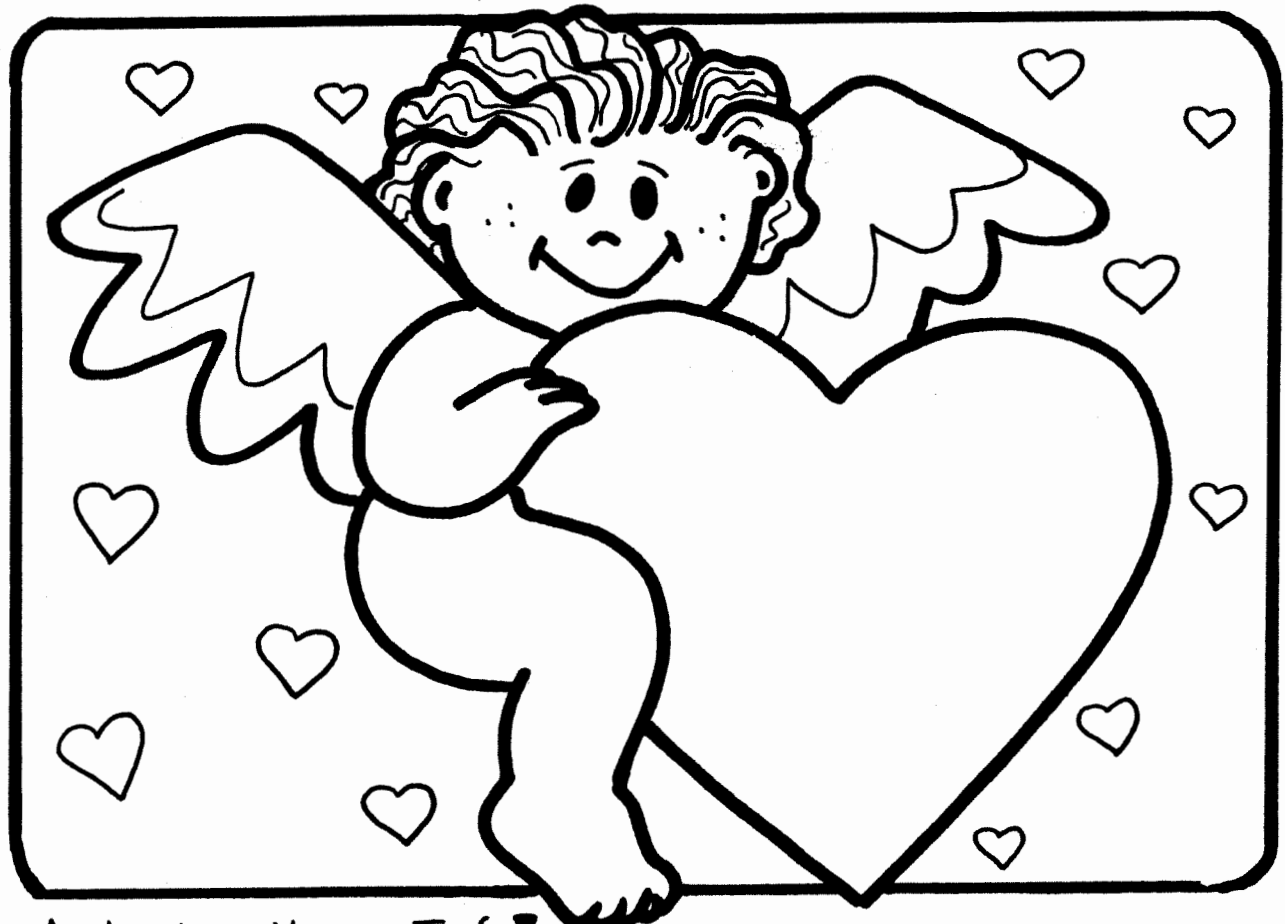
♥ Will You Be My Valentine on February 14?

Student Objective: To find and count the various objects in the picture.

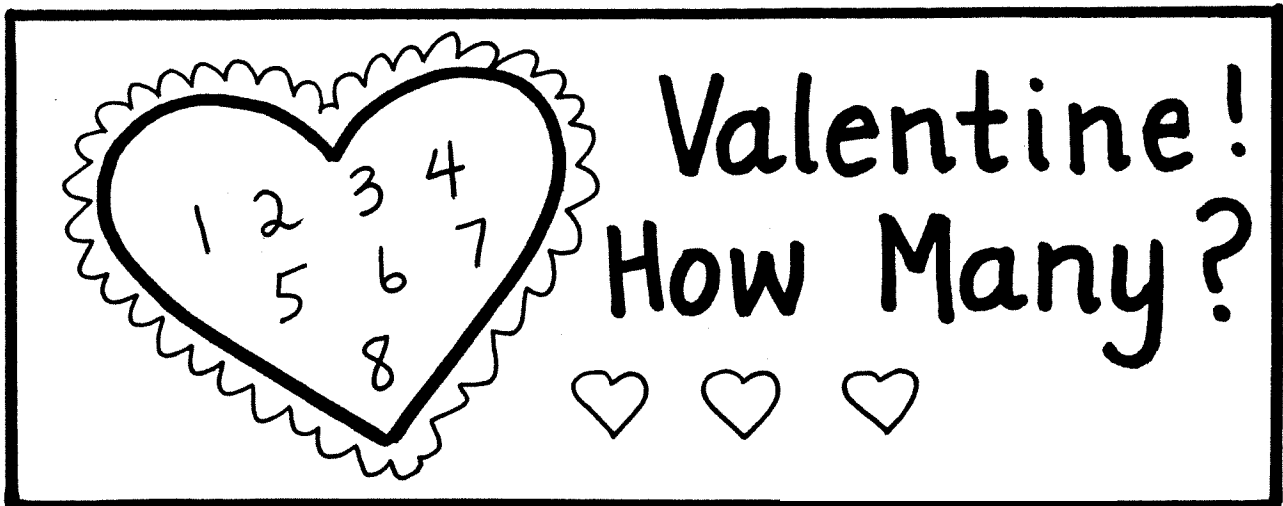
You'll need: a file folder, crayons, 12 bingo markers, glue, scissors.

Class Play

Lesson # 6 - Valentine's Day - *Cupid's Spell*

Suggested Teaching Strategies

After reading through a Readers Theatre script with the class, discuss with the students the different aspects of the play: what do you think each character looked like; what was it about their personalities that was admirable and not-so-admirable; how might their voices sound; what clothing might each character be wearing?

A good means for practicing a play is by a **Circle Reading**, where the students gather in a circle, and in a non-threatening environment take turns reading through the play around the circle. The teacher can also take a turn in this procedure.

Theme: "Valentine's Day: Cupid's Spell" - *Accomplishments are sweeter-tasting when legitimately achieved.*

Background:

No one is quite sure exactly who **Valentine** was. At least three, and possibly eight different *Valentines* have claimed to have been the real romantic. The three most likely Valentines were all church martyrs. However, the most likely origin of Valentine's Day goes back to a Roman feast celebrating the God, *Lupercus*. During that feast, young women would put their names into a box from which young men would draw. This matchmaking process would then supposedly enamor the two until the next year.

Sending love notes on Valentine's Day occurred much later. Charles Duc d' Orleans, while imprisoned in the Tower of London in 1415, supposedly wrote amorous poems and letters to his wife. Valentine love notes gradually increased in popularity until their mechanization in 1840. Since 1840, Valentine Cards have become tremendously popular all over the world.

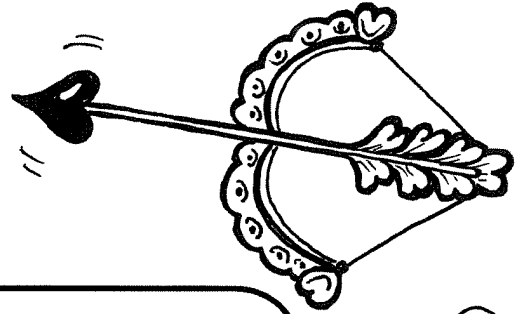

NARRATOR: It is during the evening, the day before Valentine's Day. Janie and Sonja, who are in the same class at school, are having a conversation in Janie's bedroom.

SONJA: Well, I don't care if Roger does like me, I think he's got a way too many freckles to be cute - so I just ignore him.

JANIE: I don't know how you can do that, Sonja. Roger is a nice guy and he seems to really like you. Of course, all the boys like you - you're so pretty.

SONJA: I don't care. I just ignore them. They can be such brats. What about you? Is there anyone in our class you think is cute?

JANIE: Hmm. Well, Nelson is really nice.

SONJA: No. He's way too quiet.

JANIE: He's just shy.

SONJA: So, are you going to give him a Valentine's Day card tomorrow?



JANIE: Oh, I don't know. He might think I'm trying too hard.

SONJA: Oh, Janie. How else is he going to know you like him? You're such a sorry thing.

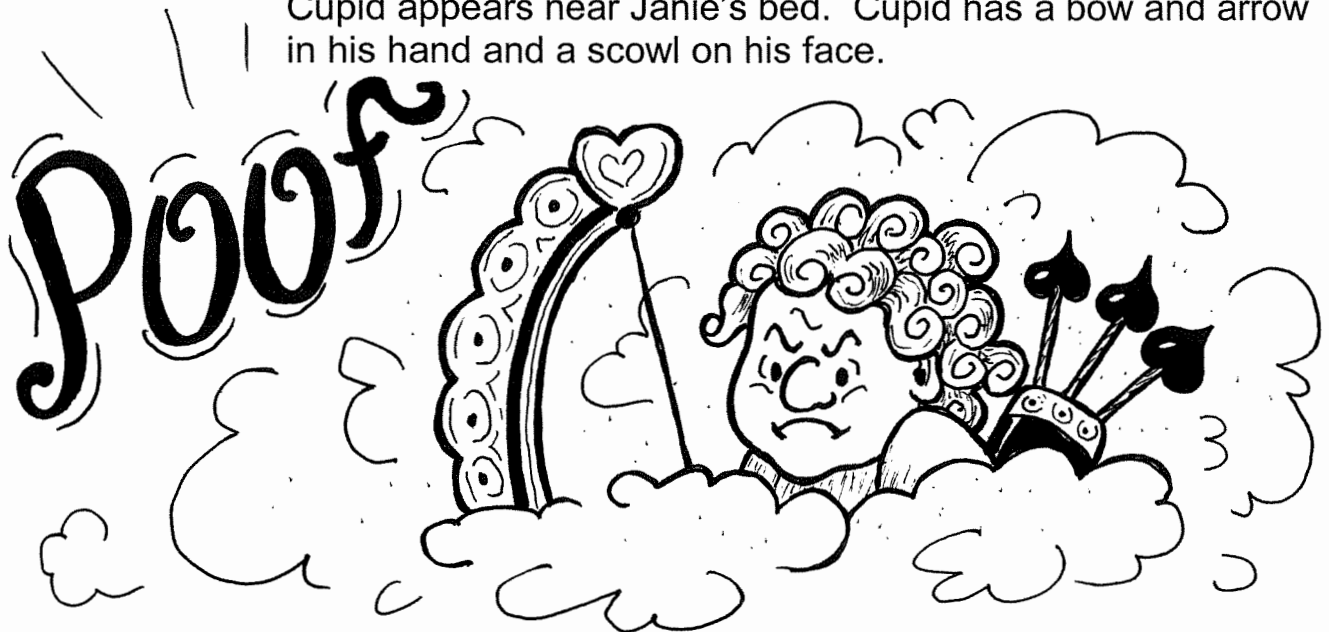
JANIE: I know, but I just clam up whenever a guy comes around that I really like. We all can't be cool and carefree like you.

SONJA: Well, you've got to make some moves, you know. Otherwise the boys will all think you don't like them.

JANIE: Maybe they don't like me. That's what I'm afraid of.

SONJA: Oh, that's silly! You're not bad looking. What do you expect to happen? Do you think Cupid is going to come and shoot a love arrow into Nelson and make him go *gah-gah* over you?

NARRATOR: There is a sudden puff of smoke in the bedroom, and a little Cupid appears near Janie's bed. Cupid has a bow and arrow in his hand and a scowl on his face.



CUPID: What now? What do you want? Can't you see I'm busy? It's Valentine's Day tomorrow, after all!

JANIE: Who are you?

CUPID: I'm Cupid, of course. Who do you think I am, Robin Hood? I fix it so people fall in love. I shoot one of my arrows into them so they go bonkers for whoever's name is on the arrow.

SONJA: Well, put Janie's name on one of your arrows and shoot it at Nelson in our class at school. This girl is so shy she'll never get a guy without some serious help.

CUPID: No problem! I'll have that boy eating out of your hand by noon tomorrow. By lunch time, he'll be drooling all over you!

JANIE: Drooling all over me! How awful. I don't want him drooling all over me.

CUPID: Don't be a ninny! That was just an expression. I'll simply knock his socks off. To Nelson you'll be the most beautiful girl in the whole world.

SONJA: Wow! That would be awesome. Can you do that for me? I'd like you to shoot arrows into all the other boys in our class with my name on them.

CUPID: That would be overkill. All the boys in your class already think you're hot stuff.

SONJA: I'm not sure that I like all of this, Janie. Think of it! If Nelson starts paying attention to you, maybe the other boys in the class will too. If that happens, you'll be crowding in on my territory.

JANIE: I don't want to do that, Sonja. In fact, I don't even want Cupid to shoot his arrow into Nelson.



CUPID: What! Why not? I'm giving you an opportunity of a lifetime - an opportunity not granted to many people, let me tell you. You ought to grasping it with both hands.

SONJA: That's right, Janie. Don't be silly. Think of what it will be like - even if it is only an old wallflower like Nelson.

JANIE: No! I would never know if Nelson liked me for myself or just because Cupid shot an arrow into him. I want a boy to like me because of who I am and not because of a magic spell.

CUPID: This can't be happening! No one has ever refused my help before - not in the hundreds of years I have been offering my services to people all over the world. All I can say is that you'd better get out there girl and make an effort if you want that boy to notice you without my help.

SONJA: Oh, don't be in such a big hurry, Cupid. There's plenty of time for that. We're not hundreds of years old like you are.

JANIE: Thanks all the same, Cupid. You've helped me realize how important it is to love another person for the right reasons and not just because they're cute or popular.

CUPID: Interesting perspective. Well, girls, I hope you have a good Valentine's Day tomorrow, although without my help it's hard to imagine that happening.

SONJA: Oh, we'll have a good day tomorrow, Cupid. We will.

JANIE: Yes, we will. And on our own terms too!

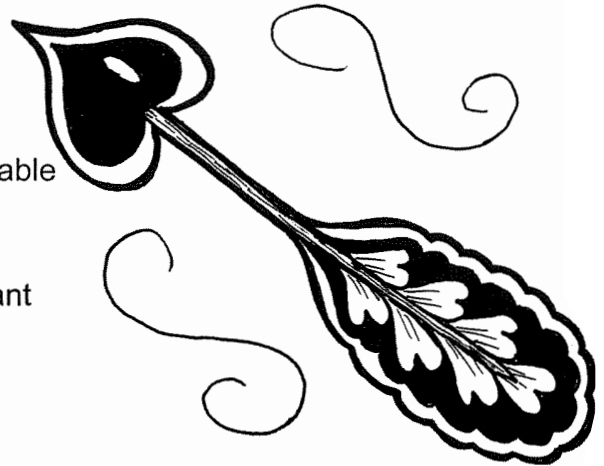
